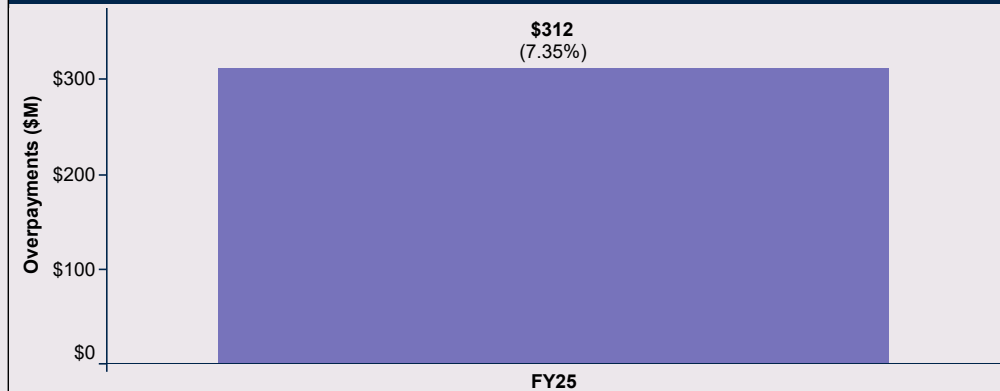

Brief Program Description & summary of overpayment causes and barriers to prevention:

USDA's Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) provides federal reimbursement through the states to child care centers and family day care homes (FDCH). Sponsoring organizations are responsible for immediate oversight of providers. The states are responsible for overseeing CACFP sponsors. Centers certify children for program benefits through household applications. FDCHs primarily rely on community measures of poverty to identify eligibility at the facility level. Sponsor error in eligibility determination ("certification error") is a leading cause of IPs. A significant barrier is the decentralized nature of the program; USDA does not directly confirm individual children or day care home facilities for eligibility.

Discussion of Actions Taken in the Preceding Quarter and Actions Planned in the Following Quarter to Prevent Overpayments

In the past quarter, FNS continued data collection and analysis for updating measurements of error in Area Eligibility and Tiering determinations. These measures are used to estimate certification error rates from incorrect tiering determinations for Family Day Care Homes and incorrect area eligibility determinations for At-Risk Afterschool Care centers, which factor into the overall improper payment rate estimate for CACFP. FNS also conducted a meals claims validation study, which included site visits and review of meal claims records. FNS visited sites in 10 states and reviewed records with disaggregated data to look for patterns in meal claims that point to possible error in program administration by site operators, and/or inadequate oversight by the sites' sponsoring organizations.

1	FNS staff conducted a webinar on the CACFP Serious Deficiency process with State agencies. This training aimed to strengthen staff understanding of the process, which is vital to FNS's program monitoring and oversight of CACFP State agencies.	Jan-26
